What We Are Learning

Reading: While we will finish up studying nonfiction books this week and transition into studying fiction books, we will continue to use our knowledge of nonfiction during our writing and science blocks to support our project work. We will review the difference between fiction and nonfiction books (RL1.5). When reading fiction books, students will describe the characters and retell important parts of the story (setting, problem, solution, the moral) (RL1.2, 1.3).

Writing: We will finish our informational writing unit (but students will use these skills to continue their rock projects) and begin opinion writing. Students will state an opinion, provide some reasons for the opinion, and provide a sense of closure (W1.1). Ask your student about the *Pigeon* books we read to help us make opinions!

Math: Students will represent and solve addition and subtraction word problems within 20. We will solve problems with an unknown in different positions. These include missing addend problems and comparing problems (ex. 8+__=10) (OA1.1). It is important that students not only find the correct answer but also can explain in pictures and/or words how they found it. We will solve addition word problems with three addends, as well (OA1.2).

Science: Students will continue researching and creating our rock projects. Students chose various topics based on our classroom lessons, guest experts, and field experiences. Ask your student what he or she did during project time each day!
