

What We Are Learning

Reading: Students will read nonfiction and identify basic similarities and differences between two texts on the same topic (R11.9). Next we will review main idea and key details and identify reasons an author gives to support ideas in a text (R11.8). In phonics we will review "Magic E" (long vowels with silent 'e' at the end) and continue learning vowel teams (ie, ee vs. ea, ai, vs. ay)). Remember, once students learn these features, they are expected to be used in their writing and day-to-day assignments. Find word examples on my website under "Letterland" — "student lists."

Writing: Please continue to work on using capital letters and punctuation correctly, as well as writing complete sentences! We will finish our fictional narratives (W1.3) and then review informational writing (W1.2). Students will research a topic (W1.6) and use digital tools, such as Google Slides, to share information (W1.5).

Math: Students will review place value (NBT1.2) and use their understanding to find ten more or ten less than a one- or two-digit number (NBT1.5). Next we will use these skill to subtract multiples of ten (NBT1.6).

Social Studies: Students will review basic map skills such as cardinal directions, map symbols, and map key. Students will be able to read and make a map, pointing out specific locations (G1.1).

Science: Next, we will study the Earth/Moon/Sun system as well as the day and night sky.
