What We Are Learning

Reading: Students continue to read nonfiction texts and find the main idea and key details (RI1.2). We look in the words but also in the photographs to find details about the nonfiction text (RL1.7). Students will also ask and answer questions about nonfiction texts (RI1.1). We can use questioning and context clues to figure out the meaning of a word, as well (RI1.4). These skills require a lot of <u>active listening</u> – ask your student what that means!

Writing: Students begin studying information and explanatory (how-to) writing W1.2) We will read nonfiction books and practice focusing on one topic, taking notes, and summarizing information in our own words. We will research in groups and present information together (W1.5). These skills will help students as we begin our first inschool project.

Math: Students will practice using various addition and subtraction strategies with numbers from 0-20 (OA1.6) to solve word problems (OA1.1). These include counting on, composing and decomposing numbers within ten (making a ten – using ten frames), using a number line, and making simpler sums. We will work on different types of word problems, including "unknown-addend problems" (ex. 8+__=11).

Social Studies: Students will continue to study force, balance, and motion. Students will conduct experiments to predict how things will move and balance in different ways (P1.3). Next, we will begin our rock project!
